In 1975, Street moved to Fowler Toyota-AMC-Jeep in Norman as general sales manager until 1982. With great business success, Street channeled his experience and sales acumen into his own venture and became the Toyota dealer in Amarillo in 1982 with the help of two silent partners, who he was able to buy out in eight years. Street Toyota has won the Toyota President's Award 21 times. In the area of community service, Street is a major benefactor and longtime board member of the Guyon Saunders Resource Center, a safe daytime refuge that offers basic services for those who are experiencing homelessness. Further, the dealership spends hundreds of thousands of dollars a year to support local nonprofits and special events in the community. For his good works and charitable giving, Street was named the 2013 Man of the Year by Amarillo Globe-News.



Kirksey Principal is LAURETTE WAURER. The other panhandle area schools receiving the award include GRUVER HIGH SCHOOL and NAZARETH SCHOOL.

A visionary plan to bring PANHANDLE-PLAINS HISTORICAL MUSEUM and PIONEER AMPHITHEATRE into the 21st century is underway, thanks to WEST TEXAS A&M UNIVERSITY and state leaders. Following a feasibility study commissioned with the support of The Texas A&M University System, WT is actively pursuing a transformation of the iconic landmarks, one which would celebrate their legacies and leave intact the historic Pioneer Hall, while catapulting them into the future.

In further news, PPHM announced that the museum has

acquired a TYRANNOSAURUS REX SKULL, a landmark addition to the paleontology collection. The massive skull, at over four feet long, sports a mouth full of banana-sized bonecrushing teeth evolved to penetrate the most formidable defenses and bring a swift, merciful end to its prey. This specimen was excavated from the Hell Creek formation in Montana. The original specimen is on display at the Burke Museum of Natural History and Culture. The skull now residing at PPHM is a cast of a the massive 66-million-year-old find, nicknamed the "Tufts-Love Rex" after the two volunteers who discovered it in 2015. It is one of approximately 15 known T. rex skulls in the world. The PPHM skull measures 4 feet long by 3 feet wide. Based on this size, paleontologists estimate this dinosaur is about 85% the size of the largest T. rex found to-date, and one of the most complete specimens. At the hips, the T. rex stood 15- to 20-feet-tall and was as long as a school bus from tail to head, more than 40 feet in length. AW
